Finance Director Bachhuber informed the Council that the self insurance fund balance has decreased. In 04-05 year showed a negative balance in the fund and necessary to correct by the end of the 05-06 fiscal year. The past seven years have shown an average increase of only 4% in the claim contribution, and 5% in the fixed costs. The health and prescriptions charges have shown drastic increases in the last few years. The deficit balances and needed cash is not a result of one year of expenses, but was caused by higher than expected health costs and an effort to hold costs to a minimum. Most of the employees do not want to change the insurance plans.
