E. REGULAR BUSINESS.

1. **Resolution 12-46, A Resolution Directing Sale of \$2,495,000 General Obligation Bonds, Series 2012A.**

Finance Director Bachhuber informed Council that the bond sale was at 10:00 A. M. this morning and Public Financial Management handled all the financial transactions and gathered all information on the sale.

Mr. Bachhuber stated that \$1.8 Million dollar bonds were sold to finance nine projects and the refunding of 2005 bonds for \$645,000. Jon

Burmeister of Public Financial Management also informed Council that Moody's assigned Aa2 rating on said bonds. Moody's states in its report that "The Aa2 rating is based upon modestly sized and growing tax base in northeastern Iowa, stable financial operations enhanced by the flexibility to raise addition revenue, manageable debt burden supported with alternate revenue sources, and rapid amortization of principal."

Mr. Burmeister stated that based on the City's size Moody's has rated the City's financial position very high. Bankers Bank joined First National Bank of Waverly to purchase said bonds at a true interest cost of .97% and will save the City \$51,461 over the remaining years of the bond issue.

2. **Resolution 12-47, A Resolution Directing Sale of \$2,195,000 (Dollar Amount Subject to Change) General Obligation Local Option Sales and Services Tax Refunding Bonds, Series 2012B.**

The 2012B bonds are for the refunding of 2006 local option sale tax bonds for the Fire truck and station saving the City \$158,100. UMB Bank joined with Security State Bank to purchase bonds at a true interest cost of 1.25%. Costs came in lower than expected so the par amount was decreased to \$2,195,000. Moody's Aa2 rating was achieved because of Waverly's strong economy, demographics, strong financial management of the fund balance and debt. City savings through this refunding are over the remaining years of the issue.

Public Financial Management advised the City to pay the notes off. The City would take money from the debt service and golf reserve fund to payoff said notes and saved \$5,300.00. Council will discuss golf reserve funds at study session with input from the Golf Commission.

4. **Review 2012 Goals of Library Board of Trustees.**

Diana Blake, from the Library Board of Trustees, informed Council that the Library has a long range plan and works off of said plan. In the fiscal year 2012/13 the bond for construction of the library will be paid off. In 2010/11 there were 155,661 patrons visiting the library. The Library is working with Workforce Development for people who need employment. Ms. Blake stated that there is major need for volunteers to work in the gardens in the summer. There has been 1,300 checkouts for E-readers in the last six months and are trying to further increase the number of e-readers. Classes and special events have been widely accepted by the community. Staff brings library materials to Daycare Centers in the community. The Library is also digitizing local history collections and expanding and reorganizing said collection. The Library is also increasing its wireless internet connection.

5. **Review 2012 Goals of the Historic Preservation Commission.**

Karen Lehman, of the Historic Preservation Commission, informed the Council that the Commission's purpose was to promote historic sites in the City of Waverly and safeguard the historic heritage. Ms. Lehman reviewed the history of the commission. The 2012 Commission goals are: 1) to make significant progress toward the official designation of historic districts. Surveys are being conducted by Svendsen, Tyler, Inc. for the northwest and southeast areas of Waverly. The downtown survey is being done by the Tallgrass Historians of Iowa City. The Commission is also investigating if there is enough houses to create a historical district in the southwest area of Waverly. The second(2nd) goal is to promote and inform the community of projects and awards and to encourage people to get involved in the nomination process. The third (3rd) goal is to educate the public on the value of historic districts and to discuss ways that enhance our community. There are financial opportunities for homes in historic districts. Library Director Sarah Meyer-Ryerson informed Council there might be a sense of pride developed in these districts that would encourage other properties to do the same kind of updates. Homes also in these districts hold their real estate values, and many receive tax credits and possible flood insurance benefits.

6. **Review Plans and Specifications for Proposed New Fire Truck Pumper.**

Fire Chief Dennis Happel requested Council permission to take bids on a new fire truck pumper. The Truck Committee has reviewed what the department needs for a pumper truck. The Committee also prepared plans
