Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program



WHAT IS LIHEAP?

Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) is designed to aid qualifying low-income lowa households (homeowners and renters) in the payment of a portion of their residential heating costs for the winter heating season, to encourage regular utility payments, to promote energy awareness and to encourage reduction of energy usage through energy efficiency, client education, and weatherization. All customers applying for this program will simultaneously be making an application for weatherization assistance as required by state law.

This program is NOT designed to pay a household's total heat costs. The program will provide supplemental assistance based on several factors. Those factors include total household income, household size, dwelling type, and type of heating fuel, among others.

Applications are accepted on a first come/first served basis beginning October 1st for customers 60 years of age or older, or disabled or who may be experiencing difficulty paying past due heat and/or electric accounts. All other customers begin to apply November 1st. Applications will be accepted through April 30th.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR LIHEAP?

Both owner-occupied and renter-occupied households may apply for Energy Assistance. Households with income at or below 200% of the federal poverty income guidelines may be eligible for financial assistance. Additional financial assistance may be available to customers who may be experiencing difficulty paying past due heat and/or electric accounts. Eligible homeowners may also receive financial assistance to repair or replace inoperable furnaces.

HOW TO APPLY FOR LIHEAP

To apply for LIHEAP, call or visit your local Family Service office.

To apply, you will need:

- Names of all members in your household
- Proof of Social Security Numbers for all members in your household
- Dates of birth for all members in your household
- Proof of gross income for all members of your household for the past 30 days or the most recent filed tax return
- A recent heating bill
- A recent electric bill

WHAT IS WEATHERIZATION?

The Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP) provides many Northeast lowans with the means to remain in their homes in safety, comfort, and affordability. An extensive energy audit includes air leakage checks, insulation evaluation and all combustion appliance inspection for repair and/or replacement.

WHO PROVIDES THE SERVICE?

NEICAC's own crews provide Weatherization. Appliance and furnace work are completed by local vendors and licensed HVAC contractors. Agency staff does a quality control final inspection. The Weatherization staff also administers contracts with the investor owned utilities of the area to install low-cost, energy efficient measures in eligible homes, such as LED lights, low-flow faucet aerators, showerheads, and hot water heater measures.

WHAT WILL I BE CHARGED FOR WEATHERIZATION SERVICES?

All services provided to the homeowner/renter are without cost as long as charges are within program expenditure limits.

ARE RENTERS ELIGIBLE FOR SERVICES?

Yes. The owner of the property is required to sign a landlord agreement authorizing the weatherization of the dwelling or unit. The landlord must also agree not to raise the rent, due to weatherization, for a period of 12 months from the date the work is completed and must agree not to evict the tenant without just cause. Rent-to-own contracts are treated as owners if the document is filed at your county assessors office.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR WEATHERIZATION?

Both owner-occupied and renter-occupied households are eligible to apply for Energy Assistance. Households with incomes at or below 200% of the federal poverty income guidelines may be eligible for assistance under the Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP). Your application for the LIHEAP program is also an application for the WAP.

If you are determined to be income-eligible, your name will be placed on a waiting list. When you are contacted by NEICAC, a WAP crew member will evaluate your home to see what can be done to make your home more energy efficient.
