Chairman Gaylord Hinderaker called the meeting to order at 0900 on Monday, July 11, 2005.

The minutes of the June meeting were reviewed. Mr. Boorum moved to approve, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Mr. Behnke. All present voted aye; motion carried.

Sheriff Hildebrandt presented the treasurers report. Mr. Behnke moved to approve as presented, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Mr. Boorum. All present voted aye; motion carried.

## **OLD BUSINESS**

Chairman Hinderaker advised the board that the contract with Westra/PCS has been severed with no response from Westra. Mr. Hinderaker advised that Butch Kehe has been named the Project Director. Mr. Hinderaker further advised that he has documents available for any board member to see relative to the ongoing events with Westra and the Board of Supervisors.

Sheriff Hildebrandt gave the board an update on the projected jail completion date with Saturday, July 23, 2005 being set as the day to host an open house for the jail. Sheriff suggested to run the open house from 1:00 p. m. to 4:00 p. m. and invited any board member that desired to assist with, and be present to answer any questions that citizens had while touring the facility. Sheriff Hildebrandt advised the board he will notify the local press about the open house. Sheriff Hildebrandt advised that the phone lines will be moved to the new facility on Tuesday, July 26, 2005 starting at 1900 hrs and that the move into the temporary administrative space will begin on July 27, 2005. Sheriff advised the board that Rays Moving had rejected any involvement with the move due to being cancelled two previous times and offered to have officers move the office equipment and pay them overtime so they would be protected under workers compensation if one would be injured. After consideration the board asked that more attempts be made to contact moving companies rather than using law center employees. Sheriff will advise Mr. Kehe to pursue other possible movers.
