

W-SR Science Club Tree Sale

It is once again time for the annual Waverly-Shell Rock Science Club Tree Sale sponsored by Waverly Trees Forever, Waverly Utilities, and the W-SR Science Club. The tree sale features 14 different varieties of trees including: American Beech, Heritage Oak, Hackberry, Silver Linden, Summer Red Maple, American Larch, Red Cedar, Serbian Spruce, Pagoda Dogwood, Prairie Fire Crab, Royal Star Magnolia, Lucious Pear and Summer Crisp Pear. The featured tree for this year is the Northern Splendor Gum.

Prices range from \$30-\$50 per tree, depending on the variety. The sale is open until March 1, 2021. Trees will arrive potted or bagged and will be available to pick up on Friday, May 7, or Saturday, May 8, 2021 at Tiedt Nursery. All proceeds for the tree sale go towards scholarships and activities for W-SR Science Club students.

Trail and Lot Snow Removal

When winter weather arrives, the Leisure Services staff gets busy moving snow throughout the City. We often receive questions as to what trails are cleared when snow falls. In the event of snowfall, all trails in town are cleared, except: Brookwood Park, and the trail South of Red Cedar Park along 8th St. SE. Additionally, the Rail Trail from the trail head behind Kwik Star East traveling East on the trail to Hwy. 63 at the 7 mile mark. These portions of the trail are not cleared to promote winter activities such as cross country skiing, snow shoeing, fat tire biking and more.

Please also keep in mind there are many areas that need attention when it snows. It takes our staff time to get to every location on their list. We do our best to have areas cleared as efficiently as possible so they can be enjoyed all year round.
