More Raised Beds and Water Line Installed at the Waverly Community Gardens

Every year the Waverly Exchange Club observes a National Day of Service. On Saturday, October 24th, Exchange Club volunteers met at the North Community Gardens to assemble new raised beds for families who wish to plant their own gardens. Six new beds were constructed and will be available for rent

in the spring of 2021. Additionally, on December 10th, a new water line was installed at the garden location to allow for easier access to water for garden occupants. These projects were both made possible by a grant received from the Bremer County Community Foundation.
