
Planting your Tree



1) Dig a hole 3 to 4 times wider than the container. The hole should have sloping sides like a saucer to allow for proper root growth.

2) Carefully slide the tree from the container keeping the soil around the roots intact.

3) If the roots are rootbound, or if they look like they are about to circle the root ball, cut an X across the bill and 4 vertical slices, if root-bound. bottom of the root ball and cut at least four vertical sides of the root ball with a sharp knife.



- 4) Set the tree in the middle of the hole. Do not plant too deep! Secure the tree in a straight position, then fill and firmly pack the hole with the original soil, eliminating air pockets. Backfill until the soil is just below the root collar.
- 5) Create a water-holding basin and give a good watering to the tree. Spread mulch 2-4 inches deep in a 3' diameter area around the base of the tree, not touching the trunk. Water (a good soaking) the tree at the drip line every 7-10 days during the first year.
- 6) Remove any tags and labels from the tree as these will affect the tree as it grows.

You may need to prune any damaged or dead branches.

For the power line, this zone needs to be at least 25' away. In regard to the home, plant at least 30' away.

Medium Zone: For trees with a maximum height of 40'. For the power line, this zone extends from the edge of the low zone on either side of a power line.



Low Zone: Maximum height: 15'. The low zone is the area directly under the power lines, or can be closer to your home as well. Remember the roots!
