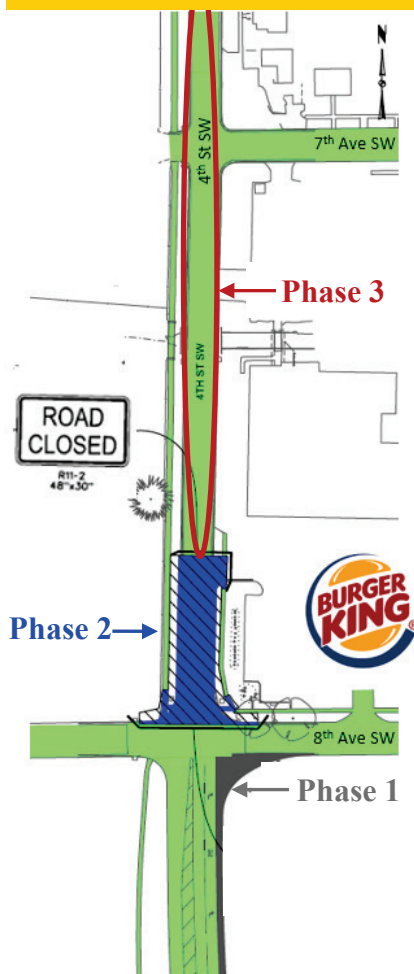

4th Street SW & 10th Street SW Reconstruction

← 4th Street SW

Waverly’s “big project” for 2020 is the reconstruction of 4th Street SW. Phase 1 work was at the southeast corner of the 8th Avenue SW intersection by the cemetery. Phase 2 work is shown in blue next to Burger King. (There will be access to Burger King from their west driveway off of 4th Street SW.) By early July the Phase 3 work will begin from near Burger King north to near 2nd Avenue SW.

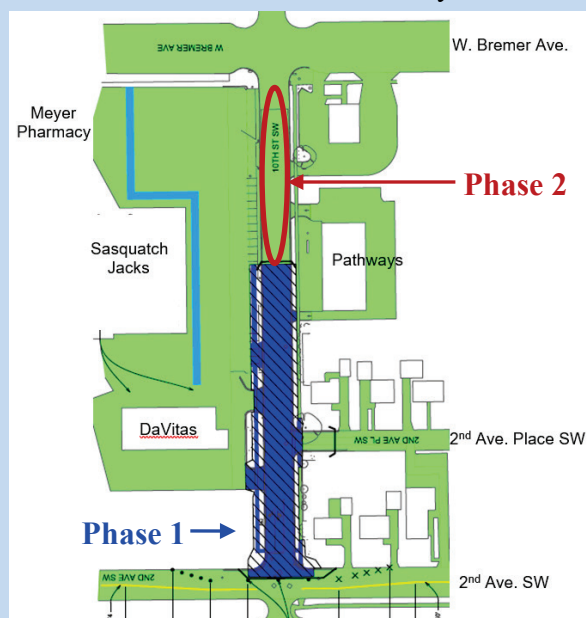
This project involves the replacement of sanitary sewer main, water main, storm sewer and roadway. The 4th Street SW construction work and detour may last into late November.



10th Street SW →

Another Waverly project for 2020 is the reconstruction of 10th Street SW. Phase 1 work and road closure is the south half of 10th Street SW. Phase 2 work completes the project to West Bremer Avenue.

This project also involves the replacement of sanitary sewer main, water main, storm sewer and roadway. The 10th Street SW construction work and detour will last into late August.



Construction Projects

Alley Reconstruction

Over the past several years the City has been reconstructing alleys in the downtown business district, one at a time. Many businesses have customer access from the back of their building because of the location of the City's public parking lots.



The reconstruction of the alley in the 300 block of West Bremer Avenue, behind the south side businesses such as the Waverly Newspaper office, is shown in these before and after photos. Also, due to poor drainage, the curb & gutter along 3rd Street SW was reconstructed.

The alley reconstruction took about 10 days to complete and was finished on June 3, 2020.

Bituminous Seal Coat Program

The Bituminous Seal Coat Program is a street maintenance program that consists of the placement of oil and rock upon a street. View the site map that shows all of the streets that will be seal coated this summer on Waverly's website at www.waverlyia.com/projects or stop by City Hall to view the map. The majority of the work will occur in the west side of Waverly (including Willow Lawn Subd. and 2nd Home Addition). Horton Road, from the Cedar River north to the City Limits, will also be seal coated at this time. This project will be completed by mid-August.

Now is the Time to Inspect Your Mailbox

Winter won't be back for another six months, but now is the time to inspect your mailbox and make any necessary changes or repairs.

- Does your mailbox extend past the back of your curb? If it does, it is deemed an obstruction.
- Are your post and supports still solid with no wood rot?

Due to increasing costs and tight budgeting, the City will no longer replace improperly installed mailboxes that may get damaged during snow removal. Properly installed mailboxes enhance the safety and efficient maintenance of our streets.

Inspect your mailbox now. Winter may be too late to make repairs or relocate your mailbox behind your curb.



Is your mailbox support still sturdy?

Is the front of your mailbox past the back of your curb?

This mailbox is past the back of the curb by nearly a foot and is more likely to get damaged by a snowplow.

The front of this mailbox should be here.

Garbage Reminders

- Please do not overfill your garbage container. The lid must be closed. Place a garbage tag on any extra bag(s) of garbage that does not fit in your container.
- Your garbage container must always be used when placing your garbage out for collection. You cannot set out just a bag.
- Garbage containers with yellow lids can be set out every other week. Containers can also be placed out for collection during an “off” week as long as a garbage tag is placed on the top item in your garbage container.
- During curbside recycling week, please set garbage container 3 feet away from your recycling container or any other obstacles.



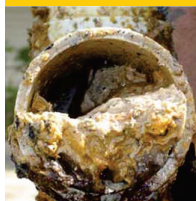

FROGs in Your Pipes?



FROG clog

Sewers back up when sewage collection lines get clogged by items flushed down toilets and drains such as **Fats, Rags, Oil and Grease (FROG)** that get caught in the line and plug it up. In addition to the costly repairs, sewer backups are messy, foul-smelling, and pose a serious public health threat.

Only human waste and toilet paper should be flushed down your toilet. Wipes labeled as “flushable” should not be flushed down the toilet. They actually are **not** flushable.

Never flush down the toilet or drain:

- Disinfectant wet wipes
- Disposable diapers and baby wipes
- Paper towels or cleaning cloths
- Fats, cooking oil or grease
- Feminine napkins, tampons and applicators



What to do:

- Dispose of items in a trash can



When to call City:

If you notice your floor drain backing up, call the City's Sewer Division first. The City will make sure that their sewer main is not clogged. If the City's sewer main is not clogged, then the homeowner will need to contact a plumber to clear their service line.

Sewer Division 319-352-6261 (Hours M-F 7 am–3:30 pm). For after hour emergencies, call the Waverly Police 319-352-5400 (opt. 3). They will contact the City's Sewer Division.

Recycling Refresher

Items Accepted by Curbside Recycling Truck

- aluminum •phone books •tin / steel cans •corrugated & single-layered cardboard •newspapers •paper (white & color) •magazines & slick paper •plastic #s 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 & 7 (Note: # 6 plastic is not recyclable.)

Items Accepted Only at the Recycling Center & Not by Curbside Recycling Truck

- books (hard-covered and paperback) •Christmas light strands •glass (clear & color) •motor oil •shredded paper •Styrofoam (only white packaging – NO take-out food containers or coffee cups) •Styrofoam peanuts •Styrofoam egg cartons (Check with staff at Recycling Center if accepting egg cartons at that time.)

Items that are NOT Accepted for Recycling -- Need to Place in Your Garbage

- #6 plastics (Styrofoam take-out food containers, coffee cups, etc.) •plastic utensils •drinking straws •plastic bags •gift wrap paper •bottle caps •photos •tissues •paper towels •paper plates •plastics without recycling symbol •wax cartons such as milk, juice or butter boxes •grease-soaked cardboard from pizza box •plastic containers that had contained cooking or motor oil, herbicide, fungicide, insecticide, paints or paint thinner.

Containers not cleaned of food, milk, grease, soap, detergent etc. can contaminate a whole load of recycling.

If in doubt...toss it out.

2019 Annual Drinking Water Report

The Waverly Water Division is pleased to report that our drinking water is safe and meets federal and state requirements. For the reporting period covering January 1, 2019, to December 31, 2019, the water supplied by the Waverly Water Division did not have any water quality violations. It met the standards set forth by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Iowa Department of Natural Resources (IDNR).

The Waverly Water Division routinely monitors for contaminants in your drinking water in accordance with federal and state laws. The state requires us to monitor for certain contaminants monthly, annually and some less than once per year because the concentrations of these contaminants are not expected to vary from year to year.
