RESOLUTION 23-67 A Resolution Approving a

CITY OF WAVERLY CURB AND GUTTER MAINTENANCE POLICY

The intent of this policy is to establish a uniform approach to curb and gutter maintenance throughout the community. This program is to address concerns from property owners relating to curb and gutter sections that have depressions, those that are heaving, and curb and gutter sections that may be fractured and in need of spot replacement. The problems encountered by property owners may include standing water, defective curb and gutter sections, and safety concerns.

The City Council hereby sets out the following policy and program.

The Engineering department will inspect curb and gutter concerns that have been reported by property owners. The City inspection will determine the reasonable need to replace/repair the identified curb and gutter section.

For curb and gutter sections that have a reasonable need to replace/repair, if the property owner chooses to replace the section of curb and gutter, they may submit the REQUEST FOR REIMBURSEMENT FOR REPLACEMENT OF CURB AND GUTTER form to have a portion of the cost reimbursed by the City.

The portion of the cost eligible for reimbursement will be 50% of the established rate* per linear foot of curb and gutter replacement.

For curb and gutter sections with existing depressions of 1 ½ to 3 inches, the property owner may opt to have the City repair the section by leveling hot mix asphalt into the depressed area to maximize drainage in the area. This will be done at no cost to the property owner.

This policy is for a curb and gutter maintenance program throughout the community on a standardized basis. It is not a curb and gutter replacement program. There are older areas of the community where the curb and gutter is coming to the end of its useful life and may warrant total replacement under a future reconstruction project of larger magnitude. The City will budget \$25,000 per year for the maintenance program. This money will be budgeted under the Local Option Sales Tax program. If budgeted funds have been expended for the year, requests will be delayed to the next budget year.

* The established rate will be set by the Engineering department and will be reviewed annually for necessary adjustments.
