Regular Meeting Minutes – June 15, 2020 Ivan "Ike" Ackerman Council Chambers

A Regular Meeting of the Waverly City Council was held on June 15, 2020 at 7:00 P. M. at City Hall. Mayor Hoffman presided.

The Governor of Iowa has declared a Public Emergency because of the COVID-19 outbreak. The Mayor has determined that an in-person meeting of the City Council is impossible or impractical without violating the Governor's mandates.

When an in-person meeting is "impossible or impractical," Iowa Code Section 21.8 permits a governmental body to conduct a meeting by electronic means.

The meeting was conducted by video conference using ZOOM from the Council Chambers. The Mayor, City Attorney/Economic Development Director Bill Werger, and City Clerk Carla Guyer were in the Council Chambers. The 7 Council members were not in the chambers, but participated via ZOOM conferencing.

Comments for items on the agenda could be made by submitting them prior to the meeting to the City Clerk, Mayor or any of the Council members or by calling 319-596-0179 during the meeting.

The video/audio conference of the meeting was broadcast on the normal public access channels. Staff strived to maintain the quality of the video and audio during that broadcast. Public access was available through this broadcast.

Meeting minutes were kept and included a statement explaining why an in-person meeting was impossible or impractical.

• In relation to item number one, the traffic cameras will not be issuing traffic tickets to drivers. The cameras allow the system to track vehicles into and out of the intersection. This allows the system to provide true turning movement counts. The cameras are for detection only. They will not operate the walk / don't walk signals. This type of traffic counting is unrelated to the traffic study being completed by Snyder & Associates. Traffic, currently, seems to be flowing smooth.

- I. Staff Updates
  - Leisure Services Director Garret Riordan announced that a ground breaking ceremony for the Cedar River Park ball complex is scheduled for Friday, June 19, 2020, at 9:00 a.m. Riordan is also waiting for the Governor's announcement regarding the June 25 Corona Virus social distancing requirements, whether requirements be continued or lifted. This will determine whether or not the swimming pool opens this season.
- J. City Council Comments
  - Councilmember Drenkow mentioned the importance of displaying U.S. flags on Flag Day. This represents solidarity and patriotism during this pandemic. As a nation we must remain strong and focused. No one or their children should be afraid or be targeted because of the color of their skin. Drenkow encouraged all Waverly citizens, if able, to display the American Flag as a symbol of the right of all Americans to live in peace and dignity.
  - City staff informed Councilmember Kangas that it is unknown if there will be a place in Waverly to redeem cans and bottles after the current redemption center closes. This is a private industry and the City has not been involved in this in the past.
  - Councilmember Birgen commented that he attended the demonstration for the Black Lives Matter Movement. There was good support, and it is important to raise awareness for the systemic racism that still exists in our society. Birgen expressed that he thinks the Waverly Police Department works well. There are people in Waverly that have their first experience with police officers who are not with the Waverly Police Department. There are people who have had experiences with police officers in other communities.
  - Councilmember Rathe seconded information regarding the ground breaking ceremony. Rathe also seconded what Councilmember Birgen said about the Black Lives Matter Movement gathering at the Court House. There seemed to be a lot of support. Some have had racial experiences, and it would be good to start with education about past experiences being shared. There will be a vigil Wednesday, June 18, at 6:00 p.m. at Kohlmann Park. Coach Newsome will speak.
  - Councilmember Beaufore noted that the police department will be conducting their annual bike auction on June 23<sup>rd</sup> at 5:00 p.m. with a rain date of June 24<sup>th</sup> or 25<sup>th</sup>. The old K-9 police car will also be auctioned that evening. This is a 2010 Ford Crown Vic with 106,000 miles on it.
  - Guest Councilmember Burrell expressed her feelings of being over-whelmed, stressed, depressed, anxious, emotional, as well as, hopeful, inspired, and appreciative. She requested that people continue to speak up and speak in support of those who are the minority. Burrell acknowledges her privileges and tries to be the best person she can be. She asks people to open their hearts and open their minds and learn what they don't know and continue to show support. She also asked that people join in attendance for the vigil, scheduled for Wednesday at 6:00 p.m. and the demonstration on Sunday, June 21<sup>st</sup>.
- K. Mayor's Comments
  - Mayor Hoffman thanked Guest Council Burrell for her comments. Hoffman commented on the ground breaking ceremony and pointed out that he feels it is important to continue to recognize the work that was done with the ball diamonds in the past when it started with Champions Ridge and migrated to what the plan is now. He also shared that it was important to invite prior leadership.
- L. Moved Kangas, seconded by Schneider to adjourn the meeting. Motion passed and the Council meeting adjourned at 7:38 P.M.
