RAIL TRAIL RULES & REMINDERS

trail map!

- No hunting or firearms allowed on the trail or within 50 feet
- Slow down when the trail is busy
- Obey any posted signage including speed limits
- Move to single file when an oncoming trail user approaches
- Trail users are encouraged to wear appropriate safety equipment, including helmets
- Move off the trail or stay clear when stopped
- Stay alert
- Signal turns or stops
- When passing, say "on your left" or "passing"
- Show respect for adjacent private property
- Pets should be leashed and picked up after
