PROJECT UPDATES

Construction of the all-inclusive playground at Cedar River Park will begin in August. The project is funded by Black Hawk County Gaming Association, Bremer County Community Foundation, VGM Group and The City of Waverly.

Thanks to the grant received from the Bremer County
Community Foundation, the Economic Development
Department of the City was awarded a grant to help enhance
the electrical service and add additional power outlets in
Kohlmann Park.


One of his favorite places in Waverly is the Waverly Golf Course, even if he spends most of the time there looking for his golf balls.
