Memorial Day Decorations

Harlington Cemetery always
looks extra beautiful this time of year
as people place flowers and memorials
throughout the cemetery for their loved
ones who have passed. We wish all memorials
could stay year-round, but it is not feasible
for maintenance. As a reminder, all Memorial
Day decorations at Harlington Cemetery
that are not placed on concrete foundations or
on a monument must be removed by
Monday, June 16, 2025. All ground
decorations left after this date will be removed
and kept at the cemetery shop until
Tuesday, July 1, 2025, and then
discarded if not claimed.
